Information Sheet

Purpose: To support outstanding scholars in the area of Educational Research and Evaluation

Information: Scholarship for a Masters or Doctoral student in the College of Education

Eligibility: The student recipient shall be seeking a master's or doctoral degree with an emphasis in Educational Research and Evaluation. The applicant must have completed a minimum of 15 credit hours by date of application.

Criteria: **Required Criteria**
Completed 15 credit hours
High GPA
Demonstrated Interest in Educational Research & Evaluation
Letter of Recommendation highlighting candidate's interest and experience in educational research and evaluation (1 required, no more than 3)
Resume
Essay (250 words max)

Desired Criteria (provide information in resume)

Paper presentations at professional conferences
(If relevant, provide: quantity, relevance to the scholarship, whether the conference was international, national, regional, or state, and authorship – e.g., solo author, lead author, or other.)

Professional honors
(If relevant, provide quantity and relevance to scholarship.)

Published articles/instruments
(If relevant, provide quantity, relevance to the scholarship, and authorship - e.g., solo author, lead author, or other.)

Procedure: **Complete application form and attach:**

Resume
Letter of recommendation
An essay (approximately 250 words) detailing your professional involvement in educational research and evaluation and your commitment to the field in your anticipated professional career. You should demonstrate your familiarity with educational research and evaluation by incorporating it in the foregoing discussion.

Selection: The ETRA Department Research & Development Committee will choose the Recipient. The committee's decision will be final. Successful candidates will be notified by e-mail.
