Information Sheet

Purpose: To enable outstanding scholars to participate in professional meetings and conferences related to Instructional Technology

Information: Scholarship for participation in professional meetings and conferences related to Instructional Technology

Eligibility: All applicants must be at the doctoral level in the Instructional Technology program; must be able to demonstrate both academic and professional achievement in the field of Instructional Technology and Design; and must have a paper or presentation related to Instructional Technology accepted at an international, state, or national conference for the coming year.

Graduate student must have completed a minimum of 24 credit hours by date of application.

Criteria: **Required Criteria**
Completed 24 hours
Letter of recommendation highlighting candidate's interest and experience in instructional technology (1 required, no more than 3)
High GPA
Resume
Acceptance of paper/presentation at IT- related conference (Include copy of abstract, authorship list, complete proposal, and acceptance letter)

Desired Criteria (Provide information in resume)
Paper presentations at professional conferences
(If relevant, provide: quantity, relevance to the scholarship, whether the conference was international, national, regional, or state, and authorship – e.g., solo author, lead author, or other.)
Professional honors
(If relevant, provide quantity and relevance to scholarship.)
Published articles/instruments
(If relevant, provide quantity, relevance to the scholarship, and authorship - e.g., solo author, lead author, or other.)

Procedure: **Complete application form and attach:**
Resume
Letter of recommendation
Paper proposal (copy of abstract, authorship, complete proposal, and acceptance letter)

Selection: The ETRA Department Research and Development committee will choose the Recipient. The committee's decision will be final. Successful candidates will be notified by e-mail.

Deadline: September 1st and February 1st. (Awarded twice a year)
