- Purpose:** To support outstanding nontraditional graduate students pursuing a certification as a Library Information Specialist.
- Information:** Scholarship for a nontraditional graduate student pursuing a certification as a Library Information Specialist.
- Eligibility:** Nontraditional graduate students (over age 25) majoring in instructional technology seeking certification as a library information specialist. The student receiving the award should be committed to teaching after graduation.

Paper presentations at professional conferences

Write an essay (250 words) describing your commitment to school library media and to teaching in the field after graduation.
